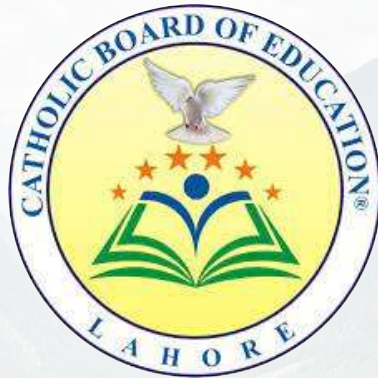

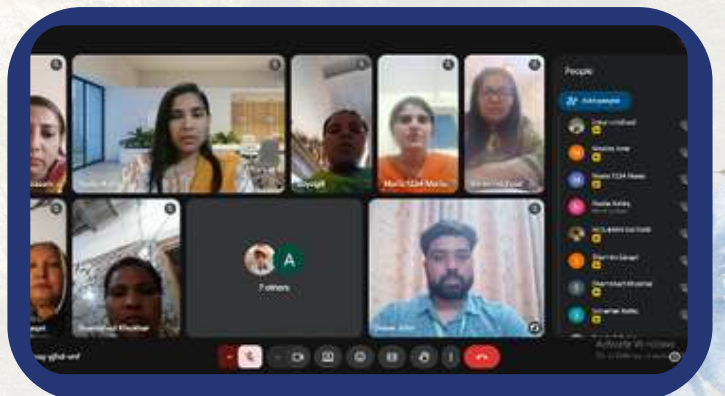
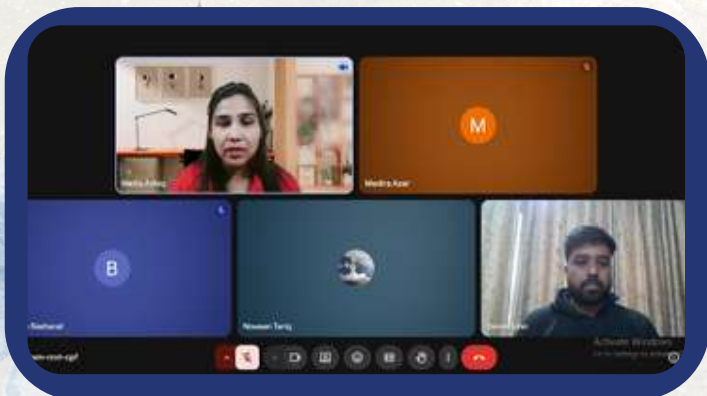
Money Management and Entrepreneurship

A Money Management and Entrepreneurship training session was conducted for all Spark Teachers across the clusters on 24th and 30th January 2026, equipping participants with practical strategies to promote financial literacy and entrepreneurial thinking among students.

The CBE-L Copy Presentation and Checking Policy Module, titled "Effective Copy Presentation and Meaningful Correction," was conducted for all clusters on 7th, 14th, and 17th March 2026 to strengthen teachers' practices in maintaining high standards of copy presentation and providing effective, meaningful feedback to support student learning.



Early Childhood Care and Education Program

The Early Childhood Care and Education (ECCE) One-Year Diploma Programme is delivered through monthly sessions conducted during the third week of each month. The programme equips participants with essential knowledge and practical skills in child development, early childhood teaching methodologies, health, nutrition and safety, basic English language proficiency, professional ethics, art and craft, observational techniques, emotional intelligence, stress management, and family partnerships to promote the holistic development of young children.



Diocesan Scholarship Ceremony

The Diocesan Scholarship Ceremony, held on 16th February 2026, celebrated the outstanding achievements of deserving students. The event reflected the Catholic Board of Education Lahore's continued commitment to recognising academic excellence and supporting deserving students in their educational journey.

On this occasion, the National Catholic Education Commission (NCEC) also presented the Bishop Anthony Lobo Trophy to the highest-achieving students of Classes 9 and 10 in recognition of their outstanding performance in the BISE 2025 examinations.



Lenten Pilgrimage to the National Shrine of Mariamabad

A pilgrimage to the National Shrine of Mariamabad was organized on 25th March 2026 as part of the Lenten journey to pay tribute to the Blessed Virgin Mary and deepen spiritual reflection. The Reflection day brought together CBE-L staff, NCEC representatives, and school principals for a time of prayer, reflection, and fellowship.

Punjab Education, Curriculum, Training and Assessment Authority PECTAA

On 18th March 2026, a PECTAA session was conducted by Prof. Babar Khokhar for principals and teachers on effective preparation strategies for Classes 8–10 Board Examinations. The session provided practical guidance on paper preparation, student readiness, and examination best practices to enhance students' confidence and academic performance.



Mr. Leonard Creed MISEREOR Visit

On 20th April 2026, Mr. Leonard Creed from MISEREOR visited the Catholic Board of Education Lahore and two schools Sacred Heart Cathedral Girls High School, Temple Road, Lahore, and St. Peter's High School, Township, Lahore to monitor the implementation and progress of the MISEREOR-supported project through NCEC.



Scottish Scholarship Ceremony

The Scottish Scholarship Ceremony, held on 16th April 2026, recognised students of exceptional academic merit from Grades 7 to 12. The ceremony highlighted the importance of perseverance, commitment, and academic excellence, while encouraging the awardees to continue striving for success in their educational journey.



Annual Certification Ceremony

The Annual Certification Ceremony, held on 23rd May 2026, honoured teachers and Students. Certificates were presented in recognition of their commitment to continuous learning and professional growth. The event also celebrated the presentation of CBE-L Running Trophies to outstanding achievers in the BISE Results, along with the successful completion of the Montessori Diploma Programme and the NCEC Leadership Programme.



Centralized Assessment For 9th & 10th Classes:

Planning and Making of Handbook

National Catholic Education Commission and Teacher Educators Catholic Board of Education Lahore, CBE Multan, and the Diocesan Board of Education (DBE) gathered on 2nd – 3rd February 2026 to collaboratively finalise the Centralised Assessment Handbook for Grades 9 and 10, ensuring a standardised, fair, and quality-driven assessment framework for Catholic schools.



CBE-L Six Months Leadership Course

The six-month Leading with Impact: Teacher Leadership Development Programme was successfully completed in April 2026 with the participation of 13 teachers. The final module, Mentoring, Decision-Making, and Resilience, was conducted on 30 January 2026. Participants completed their final assignments and assessments in March 2026, followed by an online feedback session where constructive feedback was shared to support their continued professional growth.



Provident Fund (PF) Implementation

A meeting was held on 24th April 2026 to review the implementation status of the Provident Fund (PF) across CBE-L schools. The discussion focused on collecting data regarding the number of schools that have established a Provident Fund and a dedicated PF bank account, as well as the total number of employees enrolled in the scheme. The meeting also addressed the standard procedures for establishing, managing, and operating the Provident Fund to ensure consistency, compliance, and effective implementation across all schools.



Provident Fund Policy Development Meeting

On 28th April 2026, the Catholic Board of Education Lahore (CBE-L), in collaboration with the accountants of St. Anthony's High School, Lawrence Road, Lahore; St. Anthony's High School, Faisal Town, Lahore; and Sacred Heart Girls High School, 1-Temple Road, Lahore, held a consultative meeting to develop a comprehensive Provident Fund Policy. The participants worked collaboratively to draft the policy framework, including its rules, regulations, eligibility criteria, operational procedures, and governance guidelines, with the aim of ensuring a transparent, consistent, and sustainable Provident Fund system across CBE-L schools.



Need Base Training

Don Bosco High School, 22-Empress Road, Lahore

Teachers at Don Bosco High School participated in a series of need-based professional development sessions conducted on 3rd-5th and 13th June 2026. The training focused on teaching beyond the textbook, effective strategies for teaching diverse learners, conducting effective online classes, and the integration of digital technologies and AI in education.



Sacred Heart Boys High School, Lawrence Road, Lahore

On 8th-9th June 2026 Sacred Heart Boys High School hosted a focused need based training program. Teachers explored methods for conducting effective use of Digitalization and AI integration in classrooms. Creative methodologies for going beyond the textbook were shared.



St. Mary's High School, Bedian Road Lidher, Lahore

St. Mary's High School participated in a series of professional development sessions focused on mastering the art of lesson planning, effective classroom displays, and the Copy Presentation and Checking Policy.



St. Francis High School, Francisabad, Gujranwala

St. Francis High School welcomed a multi-day need-based training program from 10th-12th June 2026. Sessions covered Digital and AI tools, classroom management, and diverse learners. Teacher well-being and mental health were also key discussion points.



St. John's Boys High School, Youhanabad, Lahore

St. John's Boys High School hosted training on creative teaching strategies on 18th-19th June 2026. Time management techniques for teachers were a key focus area. Sessions encouraged moving learning beyond the traditional textbook. Teachers gained renewed strategies for daily classroom organization.



St. Anthony's High School, Bagrian Green Town, Lahore

St. Anthony's High School concluded its need-based professional development program from 20th –23rd June 2026. The sessions focused on positive motivation strategies and conflict resolution, equipping teachers with practical approaches to fostering collaboration and managing classroom challenges effectively.



Inquiry-Based Learning IBL

On 10th March 2026, an orientation session was conducted for principals of selected schools on the implementation of Inquiry-Based Learning (IBL) Projects for Grades 5–7. Three inquiry themes, Say No to Junk, Screen Usage Trends, and Let's Bottle It Up were introduced to guide students in research, data collection, analysis, and solution-based learning to address real-world issues.



Coordinator Training for Inquiry-Based Learning (IBL)

An introductory session was conducted on 8th April 2026 for the coordinators of selected schools to provide comprehensive guidelines and reporting formats for the implementation of the Inquiry-Based Learning (IBL) Projects. The session equipped coordinators with the necessary tools and strategies to effectively facilitate and support students throughout their research inquiries.
